FrontlineSMS is a free, open-source software that allows you to communicate through text messaging with large groups of people anywhere there is a mobile signal; therefore, this enables you to mass communicate without the internet.

This is truly revolutionary, and it is organizations like yours that the creator had in mind. To learn more about what FrontlineSMS can do, how to download and install it and other important information, read on!

(Call for Proposals) UNPFII Trust Fund on Indigenous Issues
Overview

The Trust Fund for the Second Decade was established to promote, support and implement the objectives of the Decade. The Fund will give priority to projects concerning the main areas of the Second Decade: culture, education, health, human Rights, the environment and social and economic development. The Advisory Group for the Trust Fund for the Second Decade consists of members of the Permanent Forum's Bureau.

Indigenous organizations or organizations working for indigenous peoples can

apply for small grants from the Trust Fund. Guidelines to applicants for the Fund will be available when the call opens every year. It is expected that the Fund will mainly be used for small grants projects with a budget for up to 10,000 US\$ covering one year's expenses.

2012 Call for Proposals

Applications for grants under the Small Grants Programme under the Second Decade will be accepted between 1 July 2011 and 1 September 2011. Applications are to be submitted to: indigenousfund@un.org during this time period. The proposals will be assessed by the Bureau of the UN Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues in December 2011 and successful applicants will receive notice thereafter. A list of organizations awarded grants will also be posted on this website.

Please note:

Use of SPFI application form is mandatory, and all information must be submitted as requested in the application form. Project must have a focus on indigenous peoples. Projects will be disregarded if the required information is not present. Additional information pertaining to the proposal will not be accepted beyond the deadline of submission. Applications submitted outside of this time period or to other email addresses will not be considered for funding.

(Call for Nominations) Cordaid HIV/AIDS Award 2011

The Catholic Organisation for Relief and Development (Cordaid) is seeking nominations from organisations actively involved in strengthening the linking between community and formal health and care services for people living with HIV. Cordaid wishes to award two organisations – one Civil Society Organisation and one Faith Based Organisation – showing leadership, commitment and vision in this field. Awards of €10,000 each will be presented to the award winning organisations.

Selection Criteria

The criteria for organisations selected are those who:

- Display vision and leadership around linking community- and formal health and care services for people living with HIV
- Provide evidence of substantial impact and/or success achieved in this field
- Demonstrate innovative ways to strengthen the link community- and formal health and care services for people living with HIV
- Demonstrate an active involvement of people affected and infected by HIV in programme development and implementation

- Take into consideration sustainability (and scaling up) of their linking activities at local, national and/or regional levels (through lobby/advocacy/training)

Cordaid HIV and AIDS Award Amount

Awards of €10,000 each will be presented to the award winning organisations:

- 1 Civil Society Organisation (€10.000)
- 1 Faith Based Organisation (€10.000)

Award Delivery

The awards will be handed over to Award Winners on the 1st of December 2011 in the Netherlands at the National STI*HIV*SEX Conference. Award Winners will be invited to give presentations about their work while in the Netherlands.

Responsibilities of Awarded Organisations

The funds linked to the Award have to be used for activities strengthening linkages between community- and formal health and care services for people living with HIV, with a maximum of 7% administration costs. The funds will be made available upon receipt and approval of a detailed description of planned activities and budget (to be presented before January 31, 2012). Upon completion of the project, a brief report will be requested by Cordaid. Last date for submission of nominations is September 1, 2011

About the Software

FrontlineSMS is award winning, free, open source software that turns a laptop and a mobile phone into a central communications hub. Once installed, the program enables users to send and receive text messages with groups of people through mobile phones. What you communicate is up to you, making FrontlineSMS useful in many different ways.

- It does not require an Internet connection.
- Attach a phone and SIM card, and pay your local operator per SMS as usual.
- It stores all phone numbers and records all incoming and outgoing messages.
- All data lives on your computer, not on servers controlled by someone else.
- You can send messages to individuals or large groups, and reply individually – useful for fieldwork or during surveys.
- It is easy to install and requires little or no training to use.
- Developers can freely take the source code and add their own features.
- It can be used anywhere in the world simply by switching the SIM card.

The current version of FrontlineSMS (1.6) comes with on-screen language support for English, Arabic, Azerbaijani, Bengali, German, Spanish, Finnish, French, Hindi, Indonesian, Khmer, Portuguese, Russian, Swahili and Chinese

What FrontlineSMS can do

So, what is FrontlineSMS? Well, FrontlineSMS turns a laptop – or desktop –

computer and a mobile phone or modem into a two-way group messaging hub. Since it works anywhere there's a mobile signal, it doesn't need the Internet, a major advantage for many grassroots NGOs. Once you have the software running on your computer, you can send messages to wide groups of people, and collect responses to any questions or surveys you might want to run, all via text message.

What can FrontlineSMS do for me?

Are you a locally- or internationally-based NGO looking at the potential to use mobile phone text messages to reach specific groups of individuals within a target community? FrontlineSMS is the complete text messaging solution for the non-profit sector:

- > Create and manage all of your SMS-related contact groups

- > Run your own text-based information service via the automated ReplyManager
